FEUCI COURSE

ELECTRIC UTILITY CONTRACTS FOR NON-LAWYERS




OVERVIEW

This course is designed to provide developers of energy projects, those working at electric utilities, and other non-legal professionals in the energy industry with an overview of the structure and mechanics of contracts that are commonly encountered in the energy industry. The course has two major points of focus: first, the instructors will offer information and insights into the basic structure, language, and interpretation of contracts. They will identify common themes, purposes, and provisions in legal agreements and provide suggestions for how a non-lawyer can help develop and work with better legal documents. They will break down and analyze key provisions and will help participants gain familiarity and comfort with legal terminology and concepts. Second, the instructors give participants an opportunity to read sample agreement provisions, identify drafting flaws, and discuss ways to address and resolve those issues, including a real-time review session where participants help mark up a flawed confidentiality agreement. The session will provide the participants with a better understanding of the intricacies involved with drafting and interpreting various terms and conditions, talk about integrating multiple documents to avoid legal pitfalls, and will attempt to demystify some of the "legalese" or "boilerplate" provisions commonly found in contracts.

LEARNING OUTCOMES

- Identify the fundamental purpose and key provisions of the major agreements used in the electric utilities industry
- Review basic legal terminology and concepts providing familiarity and comfort to those working with the agreements
- Evaluate sample agreements and draft new provisions to address flaws identified within the samples
- Analyze the most significant terms and conditions in the power purchase agreement and an engineering, procurement and construction contract
- Apply concepts learned during a real-time drafting session in which participants help revise a flawed confidentiality agreement
